NEU CALLS NATIONAL STRIKE ON FEBRUARY 1st

We did it!

Massive vote for strike action

NEU members have made history in the Union's ballot for action for a fully-funded pay rise.

In the highest turnout the Union has ever seen, 90% of those voting supported strike action.

The Union ran separate ballots for teachers and support staff in England and Wales. The results were:

- Wales teachers: 58% turnout 92% yes vote.
- Wales support staff: 51% turnout 88% yes vote.
- England teachers: 53% turnout 90% yes vote.
- England support staff: 46% turnout 84% yes vote.

TURNOUT

This means that in all but the last one, we have beaten the government's undemocratic thresholds, which require 50% turnout in strike ballots.

Make no mistake, this rule was introduced to stop unions taking strike action.

These results are a remarkable achievement.

They send a very clear message to the government, and they should be worried.

STRIKE DATES

The NEU has now announced a series of strike dates, in which we are calling on members to strike for four days before the end of spring term:

- WEDNESDAY FEBRUARY 1ST: one-day national strike
- THURSDAY MARCH 2ND:: one-day regional strike across London
- · WEDNESDAY 15TH AND THURSDAY 16TH

MARCH: two days of national strike action (including a national demonstration).

We are calling on all members to support these strike dates and to look out for details of campaigning activities in which you can take part.

SUPPORT STAFF

- Unfortunately, the turnout amongst support staff in England was just short of the 50% threshold imposed on us by the government.
- This means that, despite a huge vote for strike action, we cannot call on support staff members in England to strike.
- We will continue to highlight the need for support staff to have a proper pay rise.
- We are looking at ways in which these members can support their colleagues and take part in campaigning activities.

WHAT YOU NEED TO DO NOW

- ✓ Make sure there is a meeting for NEU members in your school.
- ✓ Look out for details of your local strike planning meeting.
- ✓ Start making banners and placards for demonstrations and pickets.
- ✓ Be ready to hand out leaflets to parents.
- ✓ Make arrangements to meet up on February 1st and join your nearest demonstration.
- ✓ We need February 1st to be a big show of strength with members taking part in a big, noisy, colourful demonstration.
